

ELECTRIC RATE CASE U-18322*

On March 31, 2017, Consumers Energy filed an application with the Michigan Public Service Commission seeking an increase in its electric generation and distribution rates based on a 12-month test year ending September 2018. The request seeks authority to recover new investment in system reliability, environmental compliance, and technology enhancements. The proposed overall rate of return is based on a 10.50% authorized return on equity. The \$173 million request is detailed below.
